

Who Should Attend RCIA?

The Unbaptized-these are people age 7 and above who have discerned God's call to conversion and faith, and are seeking to answer that call.

Those Baptized in another Christian tradition-these are men and women who have been baptized and formed in another faith community other than the Catholic Church. These individuals are seeking full communion with the Catholic Church.

Baptized, but uncatechized Catholicsthese are individuals who were baptized as an infant in the Church, but received no formal religious education or did not receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Catholics seeking to enrich their faiththese are fully catechized and initiated Catholics who seek to enrich their faith as adults through systematic inquiry into the tenets and practices of that faith.



THE STAGES OF RCIA:

INQUIRY/PRE-CATECHUMENATE

This is the "come and see" stage. You are invited to join others interested in the faith, in community, to learn more about the Gospel and to discern if God may be inviting you to the Catholic Church.



CATECHUMENATE

This is a time for formation and growth in the faith. Along with your companions and the faith community you will continue to study, pray upon, and learn more about the teachings of the Catholic Church. The whole Church community prays with and for you as you make this journey of faith.



PERIOD OF ENLIGHTENMENT

The third stage of the process commences in Lent and culminates with the celebration of the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil.

MYSTAGOGY ("uncovering of mystery")

A life long process of discipleship continues.
